Vernon ROCKS Members and Partners,

Over the course of the past year, our group has seen our fair share of growth and change. The community's changing needs, new funding streams, and the increased capacity of our team have all played a role in how Vernon ROCKS has progressed recently. What hasn't chagned are the core values of our work - preventing youth substance use through collaboratinos that help create an environment that supports healthy decision-making and mobilizes the community to protect and promote our young people.

Adolescent substance use is attributed to poor health outcomes, bad decision making, and increased risky behaviors, which can drastically change one's trajectory in life. We can help prevent these negative outcomes by working together with all sectors of the community. The average age of first-time alchohol use among Vernon youth is 13. Data shows that the later the onset of alcohol use, the less likely a person is to later become addicted. **70%** of teens who abuse prescription drugs admit to getting them *from family and friends*.

There is hope! By focusing our efforts on social access to substances and family norms concerning substance use, we can help prevent/delay the onset of substance use. If we continue to raise awareness of these trends within our community we can help reduce rates of substance use in our young people by educating families on the dangers and encouraging them to be alert, while setting clear rules and expectations for their children.

The progress we have made in the past year has been significant - from working through the Stategic Prevention Framework to narrow in on the needs of our community, engaging young people in our rebranding process, increasing our overall presence in the community, hosting our first major community events, launching a website and social media pages and more! We are excited about the changes we've made and are looking forward to even greater things in the years ahead! We want to thank all of our members and partners for their invaluable efforts in supporting our work, we couldn't have done it without you!
