Dear Vernon ROCKS Members and Partners,

During the past year, Vernon ROCKS gained even more visibility within our community. We increased our recognition by attending community events, being an active voice on social media and involving young people in our work. We are thrilled that more than 10 young people joined our Coalition in the past year. With their hard work and dedication, we launched the Real Talk campaign, which was widely disseminated throughout the community. With the goal of preventing youth substance use, the campaign used creative and attention-grabbing messages to encourage parents of young people to nurture positive family norms and included peer-to-peer messages to promote healthy decision making for Vernon's youth. The campaign also provided our Real Talk members with a platform to be seen as leaders in our community.

The progress we made through the implementation of the Strategic Prevention Framework, through the first three years of our Partnership for Success grant, was significant. We are looking forward to reviewing the new student survey data results to create new programs and activities based on the needs of our community. We are excited to continue our growth with potential new funding streams that will enhance our capacity and increase our partnerships.

Real Talk Campaign

The Real Talk campaign was created by a group of local teens for teens and parents to start conversations about underage drinking. Real Talk hopes to change the social norms and attitudes around underage drinking.



July-August

Youth met weekly with Vernon ROCKS and The Village staff to learn about different types of campaigns and brainstorm campaign names and logos.

The Real Talk campaign continued with a new billboard featuring messaging to coincide with Junior & Senior Proms, and stickers with safe prom messages were placed on floral purchases for prom-goers.




Coalition Member of the Year

What does it mean to you to be chosen as the Coalition member of the year?

Being chosen as the "Coalition Member of the Year" comes as quite a surprise to me. My goal when I became a member of the Coalition was (and still is) to do whatever I could to be helpful to the Coalition in achieving their goal of reducing the incidence of substance abuse in town. It certainly feels good to me to know that I have been successful in achieving that goal.

What made you get involved in the Coalition?

I first became aware of the Coalition while attending a community drug awareness program at the High School a couple of years ago. Spending my career as a pharmacist made me acutely aware of the benefits that opioid pain medicines afford patients in relieving their pain and suffering. Conversely, I have seen the terrible impact these drugs cause when used indiscriminately and inappropriately. I was pleased to see that our community had assembled a group of dedicated people as part of the Vernon ROCKS Coalition with the purpose of countering the issues of drug, alcohol and even nicotine abuse amongst the youth in town.

On May 18th, we hosted our second annual Rockville ROCKS Community Block Party! In recognition of National Prevention Week, the block party provided Vernon residents with resources and information about services and organizations in the community that are available for them and their families. There were over 15 resource tables focusing on health, well-being and substance use. Popular activities included a youth-created, vape-themed escape room called "Escape the Vape"; K-9 demonstration; Hidden in Plain Sight demonstration, music and much more! Rockville ROCKS drew in a huge crowd with 300 community members present on a beautiful spring day!

Narcan Training

More than 20 community members attended our Opioid Overdose Reversal/Naloxone (Narcan) Administration training at the library in April. This training sparked a new partnership with Climb Medical, LLC – a substance abuse treatment practice in South Windsor. All participants went home with a free, no questions asked Narcan kit.

Dr. Chad McDonald did an awesome job explaining what Naloxone is, how it can be administered and what treatment options are available to opioid users that are seeking help.
