CT Overdose Rates Rise in One-Year Period



Connecticut has experienced a 17% increase in the number of overdose deaths from December 2018 to December 2019 compared to the national average of 4.8%. Opioids were the most common drug with 50,042 opioid overdoses reported in December 2019 reported throughout the United States.

Stating, "recently, a demographic shift has been observed in the epidemic with dramatic increases in opioid misuse and overdose deaths among Hispanic/Latino"

### Maybe We Should Rethink How we Treat Nicotine Addiction

National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) released a study detailing that there are two different brain regions linked with nicotine addiction severity and nicotine withdrawal, and current smoking cessation treatments affect the activity of one area but not the other.

International Overdose Awareness Day is held across the world on August 31st to raise awareness of overdose, memorialize those we've lost to addiction and reduce the stigma associated with drug misuse.
