### Vernon Youth Voices Count Survey Results, 2023



#### Background

- March 2023, students from Vernon Center Middle School (grades 6-8) and Rockville High School (grades 9-12) participated in the Youth Voices Count Survey on youth lifestyles, substance use, mental health, bullying and related risk and protective factors.
- The survey was completely anonymous, no identifying information was collected.
- Students were provided an instructional video informing them of confidentiality, right to opt out and resources if the survey brought up uncomfortable feelings.

#### Analysis

- Subgroup analysis was performed by race/ethnicity, and biological sex, and gender identity to allow for the Local Prevention Council and other organizations to utilize the data to target groups experiencing greater behaviors of concern.
- The full survey report includes analysis of these statistically significant demographic differences.






#### Youth Time Alone on Weekdays without Supervision




#### Youth Hours of Sleep on Weeknights



Perceived Gaming Assets and Consequences – Past Year




#### Perceived Social Media Assets and Consequences – Past Year




#### Bullying Frequency



#### Ways Students Report Being Bullied




#### Locations of Bullying




#### Frequency of Anxiety – Past Year



#### Anxiety Level by Source




### Other Emotional Health Indicators in the Past Year, % Responding "Yes"





#### Comfort Seeking Help by Source - Family and School




#### Lifetime Use of CORE Substances and Gambling




#### Past Month Use of CORE Substances and Gambling




#### Age of First Use, in Years








#### Where Substances Are Acquired Most Often Amongst Lifetime Users Grades 6-12




#### Where Substances Are Used Most Often Amongst Lifetime Users Grades 6-12


The following list includes youth reported experiences and perceptions that are statistically associated with lifetime use of any substance use. It is important to note association should not be considered causation.

#### Vernon Middle & High School youth who have used any substance in their lifetime are more likely to:


- Not feel safe in their community or at school
- Have experienced anxiety always/almost always in the past year
- Report home/family life as a source of anxiety
- Have thoughts about self-harm, and have self-harm behaviors
- Have felt sad or hopeless two or more weeks in a row
- Have considered suicide in the past year
- Feel less comfortable seeking help from a parent/guardian or doctor
- Not have clear family rules around drinking alcohol or gambling
- Report having family problems around alcohol, prescription drugs, marijuana, heroin/fentanyl, other drugs, and gambling
- Report less parental disapproval for vaping and gambling
- Report less peer disapproval for cigarettes, vaping, alcohol, marijuana, non-medical use of prescription drugs, and gambling
- Perceive more peer use of alcohol, marijuana, vaping, and prescription drugs
- Report more ease of access to vape products, tobacco, alcohol, marijuana, and prescription drugs
- Have experienced community violence, discrimination, and housing problems in the past year




Time Spent on Jobs & Volunteering, Weekly Grades 6-12



### Time Spent on Physical Activities, Weekly Grades 6-12




Time Spent on Faith-based Activities, Taking Lessons, Clubs or Orgs, Weekly, Grades 6-12


